For the benefit of those members who do not have access to the L&B website, I was able (for the first time !) to attend the recent informal gathering of members and volunteers at Bratton Fleming Sports Club. Keith Vingoe, Managing Director, showed some fascinating slides of the construction of the new L&B – from 1979 to 2003 (which most people hadn't seen before and then, after a brief stop for lunch, Ian Cowling updated us on the current situation.

The Trust now owns or is negotiating on at least 65% of the trackbed between Caffyns and Wistlandpound and this is the length being included in the Planning Application - approx 6.5 miles . Many discussions are being held with interested bodies and each of these have to be satisfied before approval can be obtained . Progress is good - even to the extent that the North Devon Council are proposing that the car-park at Pilton Yard should be labelled as ' not for development – reserved for railway use ' in their 20 year Local Plan ! . Much effort is going into this work and it is hoped submission for approval will be in the !st Quarter 2013 .

The presentation by Trevor Garnham and I to Fleet (Hampshire) U3A group last week went well and, from an audience of 35, we came home with £144. To this was added £75 by Trevor from the sale of his latest DVDs - Gala 5. Worth the effort and many thanks to Mike, Roger Beazer, John Smith, Stuart Wise and John Crockford for supporting us.

The next TV exhibition is "Scoutrail " at the Exeter Hall, Kidlington on Sat/Sun, Jan 5th/6th and this is followed by the Newbury Model Railway Club's event on Sat, Feb 9th. Mike will be pleased to receive all offers of help at these so please contact him. The next TV Group meeting will be on Sat, Feb 23rd.
